Those involved in coordinating parish festivals and picnics know that a large amount of effort and time goes into making such events a joyful experience for participants. Many volunteers are needed. All of us, including our fellow parishioners facing challenges related to disabilities, like to help out good causes in various ways. Parishes should make an effort to reach out to members with disabilities to discuss how they can assist in making parish events such as festivals and picnics successful.

As a Christian family, let's work together to ensure that all parish events can be enjoyed by all of us, including our fellow parishioners with disabilities and their families.




Parish Disability Liaison

VETERANS, PTSD, AND PARISH LIFE

Part of the Apostolate's mission is to promote the full inclusion of people with mental illnesses in the life of the Church. Like physical or intellectual disabilities, mental illness can be challenging and can inhibit a person from participating in the sacraments and events at a Parish. During the month of July, while we are thanking God for our freedom, let's also pray for healing for veterans who still suffer from mental illness or physical damage that happened while they were protecting our country.

One common type of mental illness encountered by veterans is Post Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD). Anyone who has experienced a traumatic event can have PTSD, but it is often associated with combat veterans. Symptoms can include flashbacks during which those who suffer re-experience the trauma, a sense of avoidance and numbness stemming from the victim's desire to avoid people and situations that could lead to flashbacks, and hyper arousal – feeling constantly “on edge”, irritable and having difficulties sleeping. Such symptoms make it difficult for those who suffer from PTSD to live everyday lives and participate in their parish. Anything could be a trigger (smells, sounds, crowds...), depending on the trauma the person experienced.

As the Body of Christ, we need to be sensitive to the sufferings of others. We need to accommodate them, welcome them, and pray for their healing. If you or someone you know suffers from PTSD, seek professional help from a health care

professional. You can learn more about PTSD and how it effects veterans and their families on the website www.militaryonesource.mil. Veterans also have access to a PTSD hotline: (800) 273-8255. Often, God chooses to work through medical professionals to help our bodies and our minds to heal so that we can know, love, and serve him more completely.

The Diocese of Madison is honored to have several priests of our diocese serve as military chaplains. These chaplains strive to bring Christ to the men and women serving our country and may be a source of spiritual support and healing for veterans. As we enjoy the festivities of the 4th of July, let's also be mindful of the meaning and history of Independence Day and the many people who have served and continue to serve in the military in an effort to protect the freedoms which all of us enjoy. This month, let's pray especially for veterans who continue to suffer from physical and mental illnesses, especially that they'll know the love of Christ and feel welcomed at their parish.
